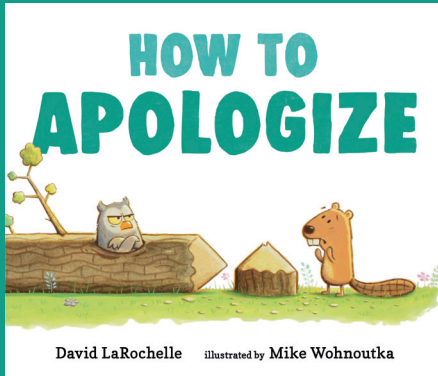


HOW TO APOLOGIZE

What do your students think it means to take responsibility when apologizing? Discuss why it is important to admit when you have done something wrong.

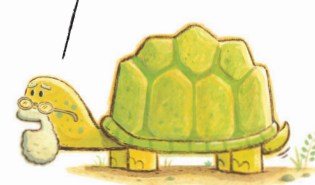
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Have students write out an apology letter to someone.
