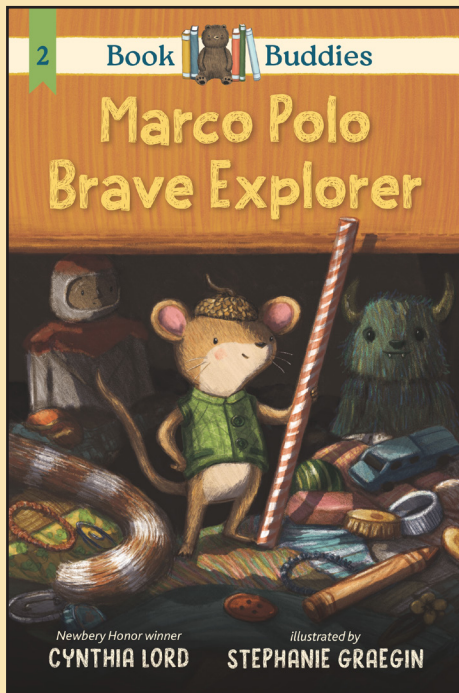


Can an intrepid toy mouse help a child venture out of his comfort zone?

- Ranger does not seem to like company behind the couch, but when he’s going to be left alone, his voice “cracked a little” (page 47). Why do you think that happened?
- Anne says that friends help each other. How do you help your friends? How would you like them to help you?


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
